

# **Enterprise COVID-19 Contingency Planning**

## **Purpose**

The purpose of this document is to outline how ECU will quickly and safely respond to the impacts of COVID-19 and changes to WA State Government restrictions.

#### Contingency planning and business continuity

The Enterprise COVID-19 Contingency Plan is supported by local COVID-19 Contingency Plans and Business Continuity Plans (BCPs). The University also has an Enterprise-wide BCP which records the strategies and actions to maintain and recover normal services in the event of a major disruption, as outlined in the <u>Critical Incident Management</u> framework.

Each School and Centre has a local BCP which outlines how that particular area will manage short to medium term disruptions to service delivery. This is complemented where required by a local COVID-19 Contingency Plan which documents the key actions the area will take to prepare and respond to a range of COVID-19 scenarios; and documents any requirements that are unique or specific to the School or Centre. ### Response management

ECU has established a COVID-19 Management Group (CMG) as the senior leadership body which oversees the University's response to COVID-19.

Responses to specific impacts or changes to State Government restrictions are assessed by the CMG and communicated University-wide and/or to the relevant business area. There are also specific response protocols in place for how the University responds to positive COVID-19 cases on campus.

The CMG is responsible for determining at which restriction level the University is and deciding when to escalate or deescalate restriction levels as appropriate.

#### **Restriction levels**

ECU's response to impacts and State Government restrictions is guided by the inherent severity of the restrictions, as outlined in the table below:

Restr	Restriction level								
1	Open with COVID Safe practices	Campus <sup>1</sup> open and all activities permitted with ECU COVID-19 Safety Plan protocols in place.							
2	Open with additional COVID-19 restrictions in place	Campus open and activities permitted in line with additional restrictions.							
3	Limited access	Only essential services and approved activities permitted on campus.							
4	Restricted access	Only activities necessary for the security and integrity of assets and infrastructure permitted on campus.							
5	No access: Lock down	Only government-approved activities permitted on campus.							

The table overleaf provides a guide to what action the University will take for each level of restriction imposed, including access to campus and provision of services to staff and students.
