## EDITH COWAN UNIVERSITY IN BRIEF

Edith Cowan University (ECU) is a large multi-campus institution serving communities in Western Australia and a significant cohort of international students.

Awarded university status in 1991, ECU has a long and distinguished history, with its predecessor institutions, including teachers colleges, dating back to 1902.

ECU offers innovative and practical courses across a wide range of disciplines, a vibrant research culture and a growing range of quality research partners and researchers, many working at the cutting edge of their fields.

ECU has more than 24,000 students, with around 18,000 undergraduates and 6,000 postgraduates. ECU has over 5,600 international students originating from 90 countries.

More than 400 courses are offered through the faculties of Business & Law; Computing, Health & Science; Education & Arts, and Regional Professional Studies, based at ECU's South West Campus. ECU works closely with private and public sector organisations, locally and overseas, in designing its study programs.

The University has two metropolitan campuses in Joondalup and Mount Lawley and also serves Western Australia's South West Region from a campus in Bunbury, 200 km south of Perth. ECU provides education to people from around the world through online delivery and via a number of international partnerships.

- The Course Experience Questionnaire (CEQ) and Graduate Destination Survey (GDS) is a national survey of all graduates from universities and is conducted by Graduate Careers Australia (GCA).
- The CEQ measures relate to both domestic and onshore international graduates; the GDS measures relate to domestic graduates only.
- The GDS Full-time employment and Further Full-time study measures relate to domestic graduates at a Bachelor level only.
- The CEQ measure is percent Broad Agreement. This is the percentage of responses which score 3, 4 or 5 on a 5-point agreement scale.
- Full Time Employment is the percentage of domestic Bachelor course (Bachelor Pass, Bachelor Honours and Bachelor Graduate Entry) graduates in full-time employment as a proportion of all domestic Bachelor graduates in or seeking full-time work.
