ECU is Australia's top public university for undergraduate overall experience in the 2022 QILT (Quality Indicators in Learning and Teaching) survey results, as well as top public university for undergraduate skills development and student support.

Our reputation for teaching quality was also highlighted in the 2024 Good Universities Guide, where ECU has maintained its long-standing five-star rating for undergraduate teaching quality for an impressive 17 years in a row.

The University was ranked in the top 400 in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2024, and for universities less than 50 years of age, is in the top 100.

ECU was granted university status in 1991, and has over 30.000 students. from 111 countries.

ECU has eight schools that collectively deliver a wide range of courses in disciplines across the humanities, business and law, education, engineering, medical and health sciences, nursing and midwifery, science, and the performing and creative arts.

Courses are offered across three campuses in Western Australia and our new international campus in Sri Lanka. ECU also provides a comprehensive suite of online study options.

Full-time employment is the percentage of undergraduate domestic graduates in full-time employment as a proportion of all undergraduate domestic graduates who were available for employment. Overall employment measure includes full-time, part-time and casual employment. Craduates are surveved 4 months after course combletion, mainly May for end-of-vear completers.

FTE excludes VET and casual/sessional academic staff.
