Project Title:

Costs and Benefits of Mandatory Assurance of Climate-Related Disclosure in Australia and New Zealand

Project Summary:

This project investigates the role of assurance in improving the credibility and investor usefulness of climate-related disclosures, following the introduction of mandatory reporting and assurance in Australia from 1 January 2025. It examines how assurance level, provider type, and report quality influence investor confidence and capital market responses. As one of the first studies to evaluate mandatory climate assurance in Australia and New Zealand, it will produce timely, policy-relevant evidence. The findings will inform the Australian Accounting Standards Board and Auditing and Assurance Standards Board, strengthen assurance practices, and support high-quality climate reporting that enhances corporate accountability and trust.
