Welcome to off-campus study at Edith Cowan University

ECU is committed to providing you with flexible, student-focused learning opportunities. Using online learning environments creates opportunities for you to access learning materials at any time, enables your lecturers to keep resources current and relevant, and facilitates communication between yourself, your lecturers and your fellow students.

This Quick Start Guide provides details on how to access the relevant online systems used at ECU. Please take the time to read this important document as it will assist you in studying your units and provide you with invaluable information relating to your study at Edith Cowan University.

Orientation

Student Learning in a Digital Environment (SLIDE)

SLIDE is a suite of four online self-paced learning modules which introduces how to learn and use technologies; communicate, collaborate and connect with your lecturers and fellow students and how to best manage your digital identity.

All these skills are needed for a successful learning journey at ECU and are essential for your career and in the workplace.

Student Information Management Online (SIMO)

SIMO is accessed via the Easy Logins menu in the Student Portal.

It is the system you will use to:

- enrol in units
- view your fee invoices, exam timetables and final unit results
- keep your address and contact details up to date.

Off-Campus Learning

Your lecturers will use a virtual learning environment called Blackboard to facilitate your online learning. Every unit offered in the off-campus mode has a unit site in Blackboard.

You will use Blackboard to:

- Access your unit plan, unit materials and lecturer contact details
- · View important announcements
- Submit assignments through the assignment submission area and access My Grades where you can view your marks
- · Complete tasks and guizzes
- Access the discussion board, wiki, blogs, journals and ePortfolios

Accessing Blackboard

Your unit sites will become available at the start of semester. Please follow these steps to access the Blackboard sites for your enrolled units:

- Go to the ECU homepage, select the Student Portal and login using your ECU student login and password
- Select Blackboard from the Easy Logins menu at the left of the page
- When the Blackboard homepage opens, select your unit under the My Units heading on the right of the page

Blackboard Support

You will find helpful information under the Student Support tab at the top of the Blackboard homepage. Resources available include instructional videos, technical requirements, PDF help sheets, slides and FAQs.

Student Communication

It is a requirement that all students check their official ECU student email account regularly as key administrative correspondence, including fee and exam information, will be sent to this address. Updates about your unit and instructions from your unit coordinators and tutors will also be sent to your student email address.

All email correspondence with the University should be conducted via your ECU student email account. This identifies that you are an ECU student and allows staff to act on your requests.

Your student email account can be accessed by clicking on My ECU Email under the Other logins menu in the Student Portal.

Examinations

Most off-campus units will require that you attend a final examination. You must register for your exam location by 1 September by logging into SIMO, selecting Enrolment on the left side of the screen and Exam Location from the drop-down menu. Please note, from Semester One 2015, all commencing off-campus students who live within 80 kilometres of the Mount Lawley campus are required to sit exams at this campus.

If you live further than 80km from an ECU Exam Centre, you must nominate an appropriate Exam Supervisor. A list of centres, information on nominating a suitable supervisor and relevant application forms can be found in the Student Portal by clicking on My Studies>Exams, Results and Appeals>Exams Information> Off Campus (ES) enrolment mode.

Your exam date and time will be available on SIMO when the exam timetable is released. Confirmation of your examination venue will be emailed to your student email address prior to the examination period.

Please remember to take photographic identification to the examination.

Fees

Your Statement of Account (fee invoice) will be available in SIMO prior to the start of your semester or teaching period. You will be notified via your ECU student email when your Statement of Account becomes available.
