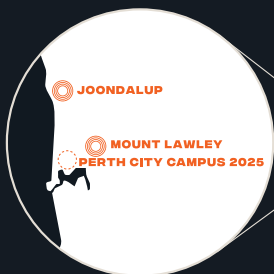

Explanation Notes for QILT Surveys:

9. The Student Experience Survey (SES) and Graduate Outcomes Survey (GOS) are components of the national QILT suite of surveys of all university students and graduates, conducted by the Social Research Centre on behalf of the Commonwealth Government. 10. The SES measure relates to undergraduate domestic and onshore international students. The SES measure is percent Satisfied. This is the percentage of responses which score 3 or 4 (Good or Excellent) on a 4-point satisfaction scale.

11. The GOS full-time employment and median salary measures relate to undergraduate domestic graduates only. Full-time employment is the percentage of undergraduate domestic graduates in full-time employment as a proportion of all undergraduate domestic graduates who were available for full-time employment. Graduates are surveyed 4 months after course completion, mainly May for end-of-year completers.
